At two years post-graduation, the majority of our alumni, 95% (17/18) are working in some type of academic setting as Assistant Professors, Research Scientists, Post-Doctoral Fellows, or Psychologists in Academic Medical Centers. All of them have published, with an average of 13 publications and all of them have presented in professional settings, with an average of 23 presentations. Not all program graduates seek licensure, but of the 72% who did, 100% passed the Examination for Professional Practice in Psychology on the first try and obtained licensure.
